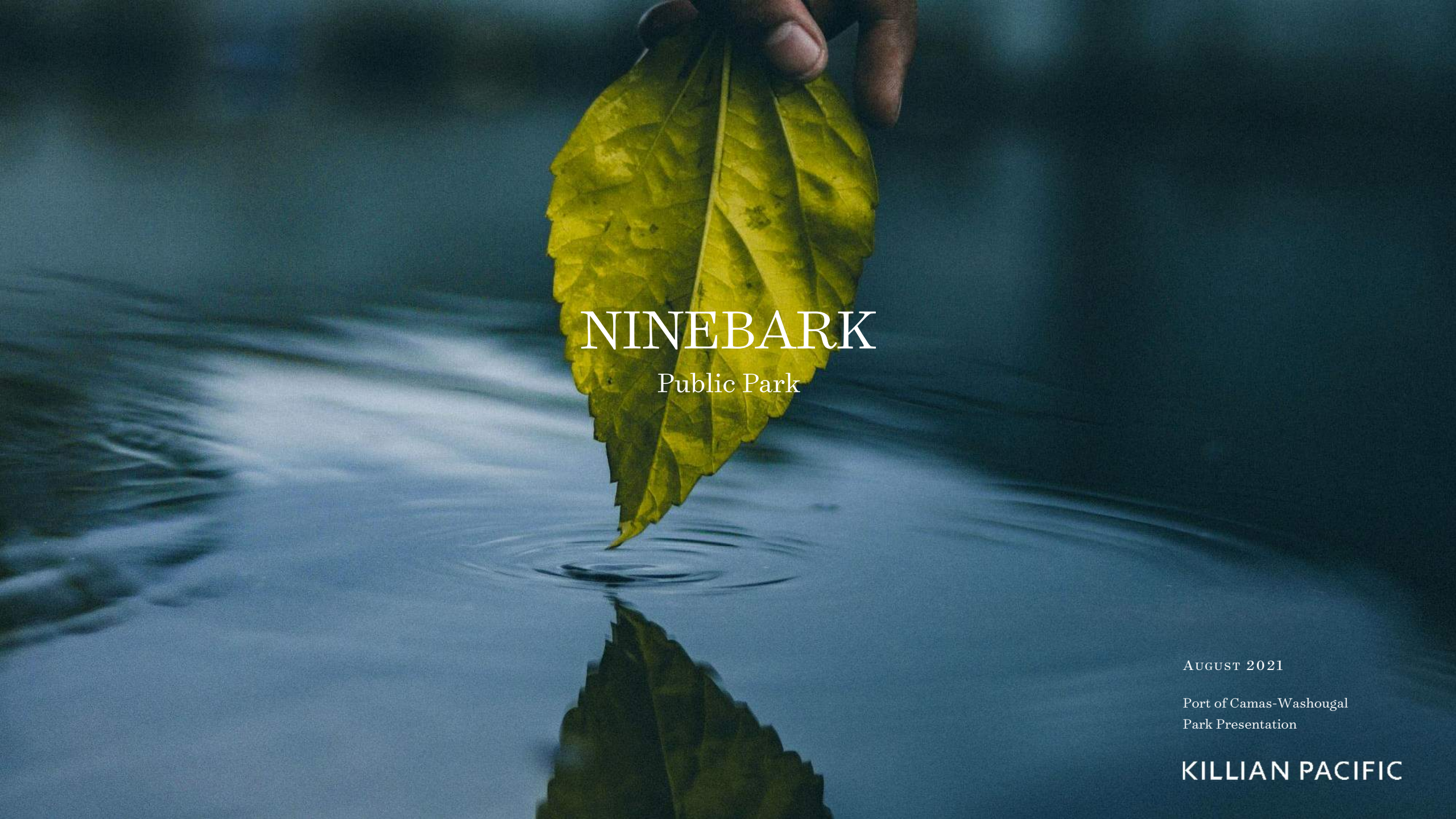

Park Objectives

Provide a high quality, diversified park that enhances views of the Columbia River, preserves habitat, and retains migration corridors while allowing the community to engage and activate the park through art, education, and celebrating the area's history.



Art Objectives

We will create a multigenerational and multicultural community experience, so everyone feels welcome and engaged

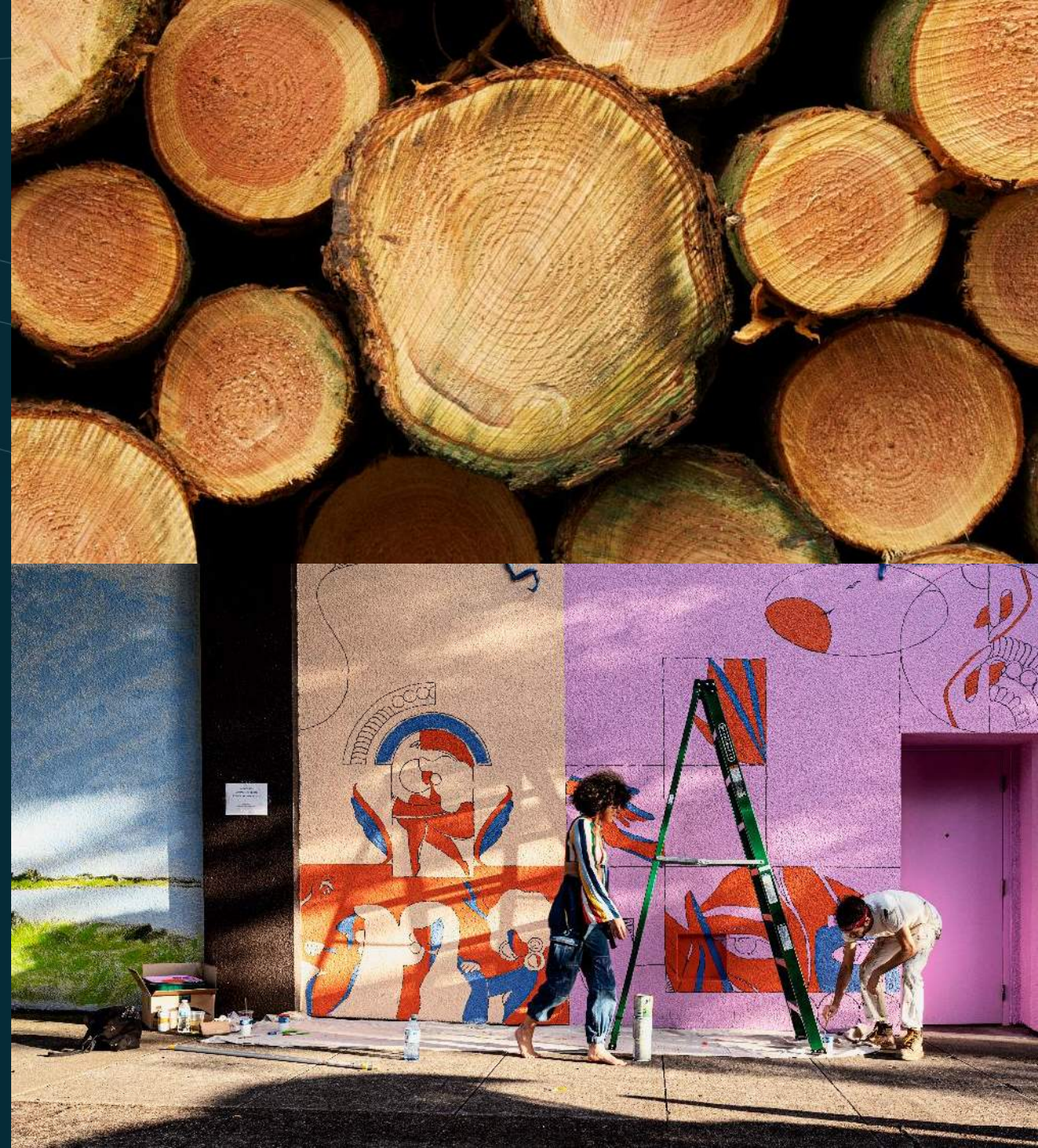
We will embrace natural elements that tell a story of the place and help people connect with the environment and landscape

We will prioritize organic materials and challenge ourselves away from using materials that are strictly manmade

Art will reflect the history and evolution of the site, while also celebrating an optimistic future

Art will encourage a calm, stress-free energy that invites people to recharge, reflect, and connect with each other

The experience will allow for introverted moments as well as social moments



Education Objectives

Establish partnerships with local organizations like the Confluence Project to host ongoing lectures, seminars, and events that range from intimate, to larger scale

Partner with local schools and educational organizations to teach kids of all ages about the public art, the ecosystem, and the site's history

Provide opportunities for the community to interact with the forest and river habitat through educational seminars and volunteer opportunities

Activate walking paths with interpretive signage that encourages visitors to more deeply engage with their surroundings and the environment

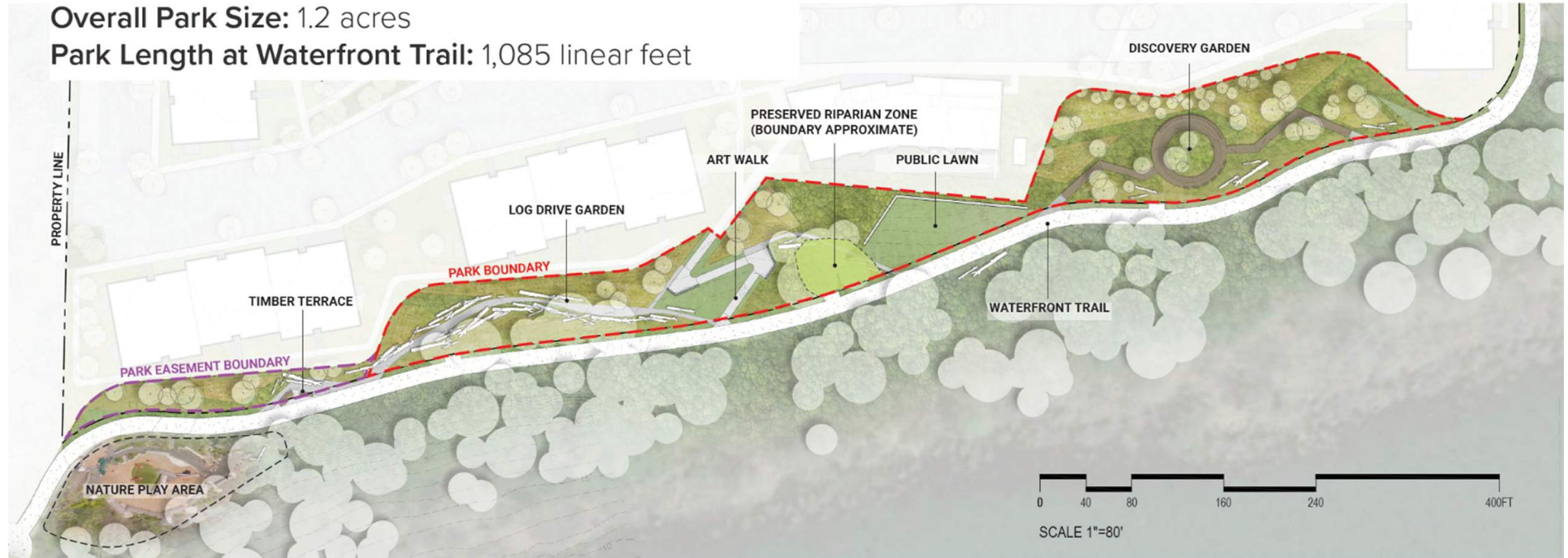


PROPOSED PARK *site plan*



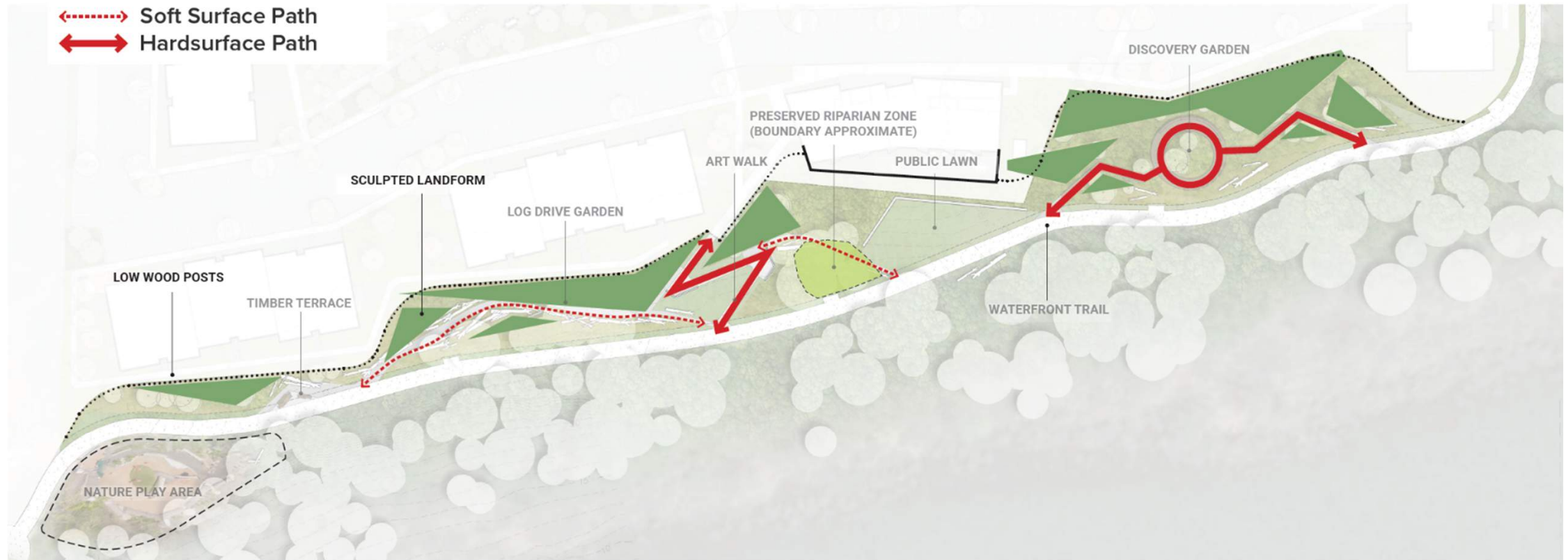
Overall Park Size: 1.2 acres

Park Length at Waterfront Trail: 1,085 linear feet

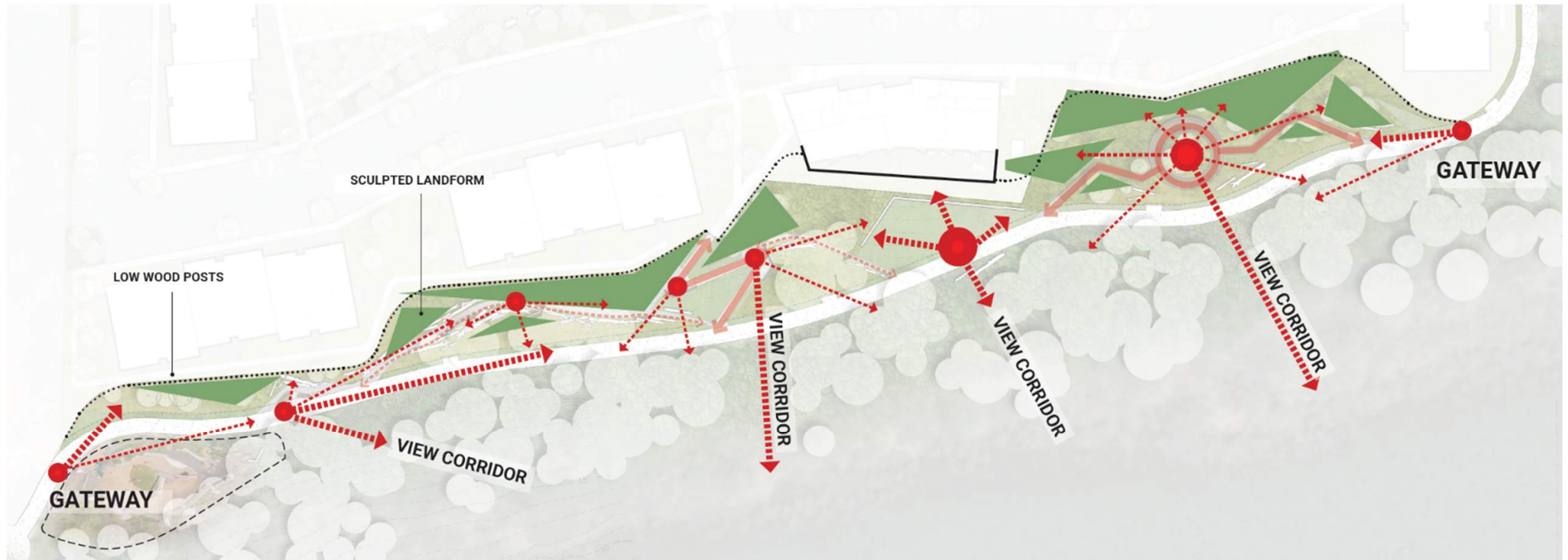

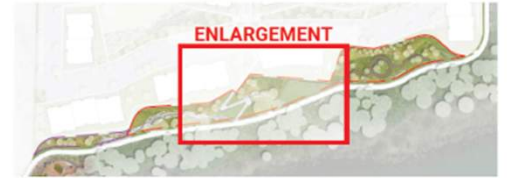

**SCHEDULE 94-LED
MUNICIPAL LIGHTING**

Applicability

Lighting service for locations along public streets, highways, thoroughfares, and public grounds supplied to municipalities, counties, or agencies of federal or state governments where funds for payment for electric service are provided through taxation or special assessment.

Rate schedules apply to the sale of electrical energy for the sole and exclusive use of the Customer. Any redistribution or resale of electrical energy by the Customer must have the approval of the Utility.

Character of Service

Unmetered electric service, from dusk to dawn, 4,100 hours annually, controlled by a light sensitive relay.

The Utility reserves the right to specify the voltage and phase of service supplied under this schedule.

Specifications

All lights shall have a factory installed fixture wattage label, per utility specifications.

Ownership and Maintenance Responsibility

The Customer owns and maintains light standards and luminaires as well as all facilities beyond Customer owned secondary pedestals. The Utility owns and maintains the overhead and underground lighting service wire to the Customer owned light standard or secondary pedestal.

Street light service wire repairs will be completed as soon as reasonably possible after notification by the customer.

If the Customer and Utility have a lighting maintenance agreement, additional charges and conditions will apply.

The Customer will notify the utility of all additions, removals and changes relating to lights that are served under this schedule.

Energy Charge

LED \$0.0909 per kWh
